ENVI- Committee on Environment, Public Health and Food Safety

The Committee on Environment, Public Health and Food Safety (ENVI) is responsible for improving food information for consumers, notably through the regulation of labeling and placing of the market of products. It is also responsible for a wide range of policy areas including air and water pollution, waste management, the protection of biodiversity, and the fight against climate change.

The Parliamentary Committee on Environment, Public Health, and Food Safety are responsible fo¹r:

1. Environmental policy and environmental protection measures, in particular concerning:

- Air, soil, and water pollution, waste management and recycling, dangerous substances and preparations, noise levels, climate change, protection of biodiversity,
- Sustainable development,
- International and regional measures and agreements aimed at protecting the environment,
- Restoration of environmental damage,
- Civil protection,
- The European Environment Agency,
- The European Chemicals Agency;

2. Public health, in particular:

- Programmes and specific actions in the field of public health,
- Pharmaceutical and cosmetic products,
- Health aspects of bioterrorism,
- The European Medicines Agency and the European Centre for Disease Prevention and Control;

3. Food safety issues, in particular:

- The labeling and safety of foodstuffs,
- Veterinary legislation concerning protection against risks to human health; public health checks on foodstuffs and food production systems,
- The European Food Safety Authority and the European Food and Veterinary Office.
